Saturday 14th September: An Introduction to the art of night walking with Dixe Wills

Spend the evening discovering the AONB at night on a fascinating night walk with author and travel writer Dixe Wills. Starting at Blakeney, this 7 mile night walk will take you on a round trip to Wiveton Downs Dark Sky Discovery Site then back to Blakeney and across the Blakeney Freshes embankment.
